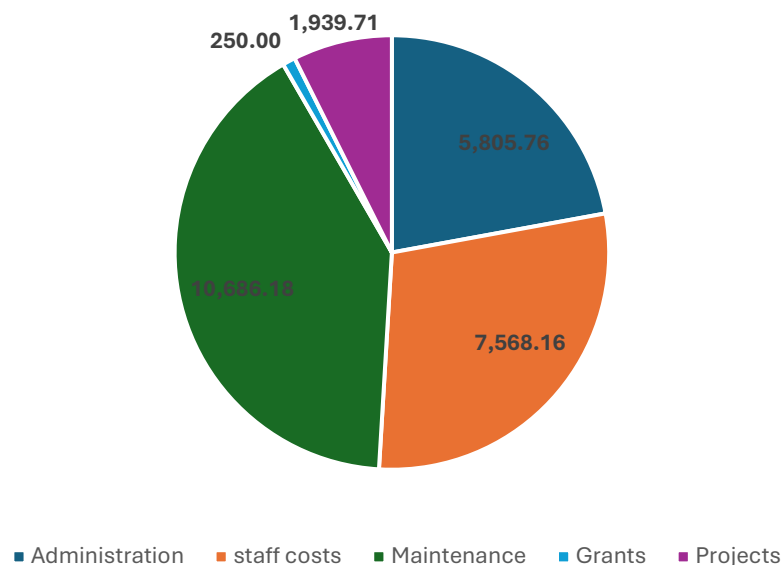

Council Activity 2025-2026

It has been an active year for LCC with no signs of slowing down, significant progress has been made with ongoing projects.

Llanbadoc:

Progress has been made in refurbishing the old telephone box in Llanbadoc. The box has been cleaned, painted and Perspex windows replaced with traditional glass. The box will have a new low powered LED light installed and will be home to a new defibrillator for the community.



The play equipment at Llanbadoc Island has been cleaned and painted in bright new colours, new equipment has been budgeted for the park and will be installed in 2026.

Repairs have been carried out to fencing at Llanbadoc Island and contractors have cut back overgrown vegetation on the access road and around the car park.

The Commemorative Alfred Russel Wallace bench located opposite his birthplace has been refurbished with the kind help of Fitzgerald Plant in Cwmbran. The bench was removed, shotblasted and powder-coated before being returned to its original site.



LCC agreed to budget repairs to the Llanbadoc Island Road that takes visitors to the carpark and around St. Madocs church.

Councillors have been working with MCC to agree two sensible sites for Speed Indication Sign.

Glascoed:

A bench has been installed at the 'top' of Twyn Y Cryn woods just off the footpath to overlook the reservoir. The bench was installed by the Llanbadoc Pathcare group and was purchased with a donation provided by the Davis Family of Maesmawr Farm who

also kindly allowed access and assistance in getting the bench to its destination.

LCC has worked with the Llanbadoc Pathcare group to divert part of the footpath to avoid passing a fragile beech tree.

LCC has been working with its partners at Native Wales to clear an identified part of the woodland suitable for planting new trees, following its commissioned woodland management plan LCC is diversifying the trees at Twyn Y Cryn and developing habitats and wildlife networks by stacking timber and felled undergrowth.



Finally, the fence on Twyn Lane around the stream has been repaired thanks to the good work of the Llanbadoc Pathcare group.

Monkswood:

LCC agreed that the bus shelter would be refurbished and the noticeboard would be replaced in the new financial year.

LCC has worked with County Councillors to have the faulty Speed Indication Sign in Monkswood replaced as it has not been working correctly.

Councillors have attended a meeting with its partners BAE to discuss their expansion proposals and to explore traffic calming measures when it comes to HGVs driving through the community.

Little Mill

Councillors have focused heavily on the ongoing flooding issues in Little Mill.

Little Mill Councillors continue to be engaged in Monmouthshire's Development Plan and how it can affect residents of Little Mill.

LCC has agreed to offer grant funding towards Little Mill Village Hall being repainted.
